The Great Revolution

At the close of the Great Revolution in England, Charles I being beheaded in 1649, the English nation declared they would never be ruled by a king.

They established a republican form of government with a parliament to make the laws and an army to enforce them, with Cromwell at the head. This lasted 8 years in which we had peace and prosperity, said Burnett.

Afterwards then in 1657 Cromwell was offered the Crown which he refused, but he was elected to the Protectorate during the next 3 years.

England was the scene of plots between royalty and the people.

Why We Came to America

The house of Stewart by plotting and intrigue and bribery and treason among the commanders of the army, finally got control of the government and restored the Kingdom in May 1660. Charles the second was crowned King.

About this time many of those who were in favor of a republican form of government or who had been instrumental in its establishment, found it convenient to emigrate.

The farther away from England they could go, the safer they would be, and America seemed like a good safe place to be at that time. Many availed themselves of the chance to get away and also of the inducements to come.

1st Gen. In the year 1660, among those who sought liberty, freedom and especially religion, there were three brothers by the name of Burnett who left Wales and came to America, and who would represent the first generation of Burnett's in this country. It is no wonder then with these liberty loving free their king, courageous pioneers this United

States soon became a free and independent nation and established a government of the people for the people and by the people.

And one of these Burnetts settled in New Jersey, and to him we trace our origin, he being the direct ancestor of Silas Burnett, the central figure of this book.

History of Edmon Burnett

Edmond Burnett was born in the year of January 1, 1751 and died February 15, 1835 being at the age of 84 years. He was in the Revolutionary War of 1776 under George Washington, Commander, and was honorably discharged. He was a blacksmith by trade.

In 1780 Edmon Burnett 1751-1835 married Sarah Smith 1761-1834. Some years after the war, he sold his farm in New Jersey and got his pay in Continentle Money, and this failed in his hands. He gave \$14.00 for a side saddle for his wife to ride on.

His Travels

In 1800 he and his family started westward over the mountains and arrived in Washington Co. Pa. on the Mongahail bottom; they stopped at a farm home, inquired if they could pitch their tent over night; the landlord's name was Bentley. Mr. Bentley told them he had an empty house they could stay in, so they loosened their oxen from the wagon, and it was getting quite dusk by this time, as they went to enter the house quite a lot of hogs ran out being frightened by them.

After going in they found the chimney had fell down to the log pole in the fireplace and underneath lay three dead goats, so they throwed them out and stayed there for the night.

Next morning Mr. Bentley wanted to rent them his farm so they made a bargain and stayed there two years, then started for Ohio in 1802 through the woods with no roads, cutting their way through hills and valleys going down hill, had to unload their goods and carry them down and up the hills and to get the wagon down would take the oxen off the front and would put them behind the wagon and fasten the log chain to the hind axil, with both hind wheels locked and to get up steep hills, every one that could help was at a wheel to push up hill then load up and go on.

They traveled on until they came to Trumbull Co. Ohio. Then settled on a farm north of the centre of Hubbard, now called (Little New York). He cleared this farm off and then sold it to a man by the name of Heir's, then he bough ½ mile east in the woods the farm owned in 1900 by Gottliff Cramer.

He and his wife both died on this farm, which his 5th son, Smith Burnett bought after his wife's death.

At this time bears, wolves and other wild animals were plentiful as well as were also Indians. All those early settlers had to be very careful regarding these wild animals they had to carry fire arms, watch their stock by day, have them closed in by night.

Edmon and Sarah Smith Burnett had ten children.

5th Gen. Silas Burnett was born September 4, 1771 in Sussex County, New Jersey; 4th son of Edmon and Sarah Smith Burnett and would represent the 5th generation. He was married to Mary Dilley March 26, 1811, who was born October 12, 1793 and died September 7, 1818. Silas then married Elizabeth Necum on December 10, 1818, she was born November 20, 1797 and died November 21, 1825. Silas Burnett married his third wife, Mary Ann Agin on March 14, 1826. She was born February 4, 1807 and died February 14, 1891. Silas Burnett died April 8, 1878 of the third stroke of paralysis from which he never spoke or regained consciousness. He was a Deacon in the Baptist church for many years. He was a prosperous farmer, living on a hundred acre farm in the south east corner of Trumbull County. It was covered with timber when Silas Burnett bought it. He gave all ten children a home. He built a new double house after his son David was married, giving him half of the house and half of the farm. In later years of his life he drew up a contract giving David the rest of the farm in return for keeping his parents their remaining days.

Mathias Burnett second child of Silas and Mary Dilley Burnett, was born November 8, 1813. He married Sarah Ann Bell. They had no children. They lived at Clark's Mills, Pa. on a farm. Mathias Burnett died April 4, 1872. His wife Sarah Ann died some years later and was brought back to Hubbard, Ohio for burial.

Sarah Burnett third child of Silas and Mary Dilley Burnett was born April 28, 1815 and died of pneumonia March 12, 1887. Eight children listed on previous pages. Sarah Burnett married Joseph Snyder, they lived on a farm at Clark's Mills, Pa. After her death, Joseph Snyder married the widow Kate Montgomery of Sharpsville, Pa. He died some years later in Sharpsville.

Zillah Burnett fourth child of Silas and Mary Dilley Burnett was born June 7, 1817. She married Joseph Drake. They had no children, but adopted two of Peter and Anna Dilley.

Merrell who was born December 27, 1833 and died November 1, 1910. They had six children: David was a very industrious farmer, always had jobs planned for a rainy day so that he could work indoors. He was kicked in the head by a horse when he was a young man. It was necessary to take out some of the skull bone and left a scar on his forehead. Another time he fell off the wagon while coming home from a party; he and his fiddle was run over. At that time people went in wagon loads. He was known as an upright honest citizen and a true Democrat. At the time of his death he was killed by a vicious Durham bull. David's wife Corrintha for her friendly traits and fine character. They both belonged to the Baptist Church. In 1904 she was stricken with gout rheumatism which she endured for six long years. Then pneumonia set in and she only lasted for four days.
